I thas been a beautiful winter, and we are now enjoying spring. During our non-summer season, we make improvements and upgrades to the grounds and facilities of Little Eden. This year has been no exception. We have been able to make several improvements to our facilities with more scheduled yet this spring.

Upgrades in cabins. We have upgraded some of the mattresses to queen size in Maplewood, Room 4 U, Wel-Cum Inn East & West and Twin Oaks East & West. The dressers and nightstands in Knot Inn have been replaced, along with several other pieces of furniture in other cabins.

We have also made improvements in Twin Oaks East and West. In recent years, the integrity of the drywall on the center wall between the two cabins, both upstairs and down, has continued to deteriorate. To remedy this, we installed new tongue and groove 1" X 6" pine boards on those walls. Not only does this update the look, but it also provides a surface which will withstand many more years of usage than just repairing the drywall. The aging appliances were also replaced in Twin Oaks.

Waterfront improvements. Camp was blessed with the donation of a used Hobie Wave sailboat during COVID-19. Though the boat was in very good shape, it needed a few items repaired and some lines replaced. This is currently being worked on and will be ready for summer, allowing campers to

now enjoy two Hobie Wave sailboats on the waterfront. Also on the waterfront, we will be updating our kayaks. They have an estimated delivery date of early July.

As many of you know camp was without a speed boat last year, despite having one on order. Late last year, after waiting eleven months, the new camp speed boat arrived. This will be a great asset for camp and for the summer staff to enjoy.

One additional, exciting improvement taking place this spring is the playground. We had a family gift Little Eden new playground equipment. This will replace the current wood structure, which has served the camp very well for many years, but is aging and due to be replaced.

Other projects

taking place this spring include:

Creation care: Little Eden continues to become more energy efficient

ver the past several years, the staff have been very intentional on taking cost-effective steps to make Little Eden Camp more energy efficient. A few years ago, we updated most of the 4-foot fluorescent light fixtures around camp to LED. We did this through a rebate program from Consumers Energy which covered approximately 80% of the cost of that project. Since then, we have continued to update the 2-foot fluorescent lights to LED, using rebates when available as well.

Most recently, Little Eden participated in the Energy Analysis Program with our power company. Although we had already been replacing incandescent light bulbs with more efficient bulbs whenever possible, Consumers Energy went through all of camp's facilities and replaced over 750 incandescent light bulbs with LED bulbs at no cost to the camp. Most were 60-watt bulbs which were swapped out with 9-watt LED bulbs.

We are also looking into installing motion sensors and programmable thermostats in some locations as well as updating some of the older outside lighting around camp to LED. Staff are pursuing potential rebates with the power company to help cover some of the costs of these improvements.

Our desire is to continue to care for God's creation by being better stewards with our electricity consumption, reducing our impact on our world, and in turn saving the camp money (or at least lessening the inflationary rise) on utility bills.
