Hiking the trail: Volunteering at Little Eden

king in Michigan is a common activity, but not everyone is suited to the rugged, challenging terrain of some trails. Steep inclines, slippery surfaces, pests and poison ivy are just a few of the possible hazards one may encounter. The serious hiker trains and invests in gear and supplies to venture deep into nature. The rest of us simply throw on a good pair of shoes and fill up a water bottle.

Thankfully, just north of Onekama is the Overlook Trail, a trail that leads to a stunning overlook of Lake Michigan. Located in Arcadia Dunes: The C.S. Mott Nature Preserve, this trail has been designed to accommodate hikers of all skill levels, young and old, even those with mobility issues. The Overlook Trail opened in 2017 as the first universally accessible trail of the Grand Traverse Regional Land Conservancy. Much thought was given to the design of this trail. At a half-mile long, the six-foot wide trail is made of crushed and compacted stone and wooden walkways to provide a hard, level surface. Elevation of the trail is limited to 100

feet using multiple switchbacks to insure a safe ascent/descent for those in wheelchairs or strollers. A viewing platform at the end of the trail offers bench seating, a panoramic view of Lake Michigan and a moment to contemplate.....

Someone had an idea. Someone developed a plan. But without workers, that plan would remain a sketch, just scribbles on a page.

Surveyors, heavy equipment operators, truck drivers hauling in supplies and all kinds of skilled laborers were needed to accomplish the goal of building this trail. This reminded me of Ephesians 2:10, "For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them." Sitting on that bench, I felt a gentle nudge. The Holy Spirit said, "I have a job for you. It's been planned from long ago. Will you walk in it?"

Details, details. I needed details. How will I convince my family? My boss? Myself? Is it doable? So I prayed, "You'll have to work out the details." He answered, "I already have."

That was the summer of 2022. I soon found myself in conversation with my husband and boss. Then in October, I discussed the plan with Wayne and Lynda. I'd arrive during Spring Work Weekend of 2023 and stay through Genesis Week as a volunteer. What none of us knew at the time was that the Craft Director would not be available until a week

before family camps began. But God knew.

Besides being interested in art activities, I like to clean

and organize. So, my first weeks, I spent time tidying up and taking inventory of all the craft supplies. Then I helped plan the Craft-of-the-Day and ordered supplies. Once summer staffers arrived, I went through orientation week and learned the intricate day-to-day workings of which guests are blissfully unaware. The amount of planning, organization and work required to maintain Little Eden is astonishing and has given me a new appreciation for every aspect of camp.

From the desk of Wayne Faber, Executive Director

I would like to give you a few updates about the happenings at Little Eden.

Birch, Cherry & Juniper update. Many of you who have stayed in **Birch, Cherry** and **Juniper** over the years (or who have had family or friends stay in them) know these cabins are in great need of being replaced. Our best estimate dates these cabins to be over 100 years old. These cabins continue to deteriorate mainly due to the decades of moisture found in the log walls and



floors. We know that if we don't do something in the next few years, we will need to quit using them altogether because they will have decayed beyond being able to safely use them.

We had developed an approved floor plan option to use in replacing these cabins and were moving forward with that plan, but since last summer, the State of Michigan has changed what they will allow to be built and used for youth camps. As a result of the state's change, we are having to go back to the drawing boards

(literally) to re-design a cabin layout that will be viable for both youth camps and family camps.

I have been working with the State of Michigan as well as a local architect to determine what our options are. What is emerging is a single-story option with a couple of bedrooms along with a kitchen, living and dining area. Once we finalize an approved plan, we will

get estimates of cost and move ahead. Please keep the camp in your prayers as we continue to work through this process.

A new development position. As Little Eden continues to grow, the camp is looking to add a part time Donor Relations / Recruitment Director. This is a new, remote, part-time position for someone who lives in the Northwest Ohio or Northeast Indiana areas and loves Little Eden and the families of the camp. This individual would help raise funds for upcoming projects, build and strengthen donor relations, as well as visit some of the local colleges in the area to help recruit college-aged summer staff. We would prefer someone with development experience but would potentially consider someone needing training. Improvements around camp. Over the past year, we have continued to make improvements around camp. Many of this year's projects aren't visible as you walk around the grounds but

are still vital to Little Eden ministering to guests and campers comfortably and safely.



Projects completed include:

- Replacing and upgrading water lines in the camp's main water distribution system
- Rebuilding one of the main sewer pumps in the lift station on camp property
- Updating the electrical panel in Silver Creek
- Replacing 30 receptacles around camp to be GFCI-protected
- Replacing 50 smoke detectors in cabins which were expiring
- Replacing the commercial reach-in refrigerator in the Lodge kitchen
- Replacing the warmer in the Lodge kitchen
- Replacing the furnace in the boys dorm
- Replacing the hot water heater in Pine Creek
- Replacing the windows in the Lodge chapel
- Replacing two leaking roof windows in Lodge guestrooms
- Repairing a leak and replacing two bad spots in the Lodge roof
- Adding reliable internet to the summer staff dorm and out to additional cabins
- Replacing the showers in Wel-Cum-Inn East and West
- Replacing toilets in Pine Creek & painting the bathrooms
- Repainting the inside of the men's and women's Bathhouse
- Staining Mo-Z-Inn, Dew Drop Inn and the Waterfront Shed
- Painting the benches and fence around the Shuffleboard Court
- Pruning lower branches around camp
- Putting new chair leg slides on all the chairs in the Lodge
- Replacing the swimming area water mat
- Updating some mattresses in cabins

This spring we are still working on:

- Stripping and re-shingling one of the camp houses
- Rebuilding the bell tower
- Replacing the wooden picnic tables on the Lodge deck with aluminum ones
- Replacing worn out parts on the swimming area dock
- Replacing aging outdoor lamp posts
- Finishing the landscaping and edging around the Lodge

We would like to thank everyone who has helped or is helping with these projects or made donations to **Special Projects** or to the **Friends of Little Eden Fund**. Your generosity has made or is making these projects possible! **Thank you!**

Summer changes. As noted in the Reservation Packets you received, **Saturday check-in time is now 4:00 pm** (instead of the traditional 3:00 pm) to give our smaller staff team a little more time to turn camp over and have camp facilities ready for you.

As mentioned in the Fall Newsletter, there will be a **3% surcharge on credit card payments** as our new machine passes that expense on to cardholders. If you would like to avoid that fee, please bring your checkbook (or cash) with you to pay your summer bill.

We are looking forward to another great summer and can't wait to see each and every one of you here at camp!
